#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF SILCHAR COLLEGE

Silchar College was established in the year 1994 in an adjacent area of Silchar town, an area which is predominately inhabited by socio-economically backward classes as well as tea garden workers. Realising the necessity of establishing a College in the area, it was in a meeting held on 20th Feb, 1994 that a decision was taken by some prominent citizens and academicians to establish a College with the Arts Stream. The College was established in order to cater to the needs of higher education of the children of the locality and the neighbouring areas. The main aim of this College is to provide quality education to the students.

Initially, the classes were held in Nehru High School, Singari. It was later shifted to the present campus at Kabirgram on Chincoorie Road. We pay our gratitude to the descendants of Late Tilak Singha who donated the land to the College along with the co-operation from the descendants of Late Mridanga Guru Surjyomani Sinha and others.

It is important to mention that, the financial support of 2 (two) lacks from Satindra Mohan Dov Trust, Silchar in the initial period and later on 5(five) lacks from Oil India Ltd., Silchar with the initiative from Santosh Mohan Devji was very necessary for the establishment of the College. This amount of money helped us in the most crucial period.

At the present moment, the College is at a stable position and has been provincialised under provision 4(1) of the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Act, 2011 as Amended 2012 and 2013. Expansion and development works are still under process.

#### Courses under TDC-CBCS System:

- Courses are programmes of study under CBCS and these may be of 4(four) types, viz., Core, Elective, Dissertation/ Project Work and Ability Enhancement Courses.
- Core courses are to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study. Language Courses (English/ Hindi/ MIL) are treated as Core Courses.
- A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or supportive to the discipline/subject of study is called an Elective Course and these are of 3 (three) kinds-Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), Generic Elective (GE) and Additional Generic Elective (AGE).
- iv) Elective courses offered under the main discipline of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE). A Generic Elective (GE) is chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline. A student may take one more Generic Elective Course as an Additional Generic Elective (AGE) but performance under such additional course shall not be considered for calculation of SGPA/CGPA/Award of Degree.
- Dissertation/ Project work is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing real life situation/ difficult problem. It is an optional paper and may be given in lieu of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE).
- Ability Enhancement Courses (AECC) are compulsory courses and these are of two kinds: Ability Enhancement compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill enhancement Courses (SECs).

#### EXAMINATION AND ASSESSMENT/SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

- Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) shall be done by the college continuously and comprehensively for all subjects throughout the semester.
- Unit Test and class attendance shall be two different components under CCA and marks will be awarded for both.
- There shall be two Unit Tests per semester for each and every theory paper, excluding AECC and SEC.
  The highest mark scored by a student out of two Unit Tests shall be awarded to the student as the marks
  under Unit Test of CCA.
- ii) Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practical classes in each paper. A student with less than 75% of attendance in any paper of the concerned semester shall not be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of that End semester Examination, but may be allowed to get admission in the immediate next higher semester.
- It is also compulsory for a student to qualify in the Unit Test of each paper, else he'she will not be allowed to appear in the end semester examination of the particular paper.
- iii. There shall be a total of six (6) End Semester Examinations which will be conducted by Assam University as per schedule and programme published for each odd and even semester.

#### PROMOTION RULES:

- i) A candidate who has been admitted in the 1st semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester (up to Sixth Semester) provided he/she must have appeared in the last semester examination.
- A candidate will get a maximum of three chances for clearing the back papers within six years from the date of admission to the Degree course.
- iii) A candidate will be considered eligible to sit for the Sixth Semester Examination with not more than 5 (five) back papers of earlier semesters, excluding 5th Semester.
- iv) One can appear back paper of Odd Semester with the Odd Semester examinations.
- v) One can appear back paper of Even Semester with the Even Semester examinations.

#### ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

- Submission of application for admission into B.A. 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters (CBCS) under Assam University will be through only online mode, www.silcharcollege.ac.in
- Online submission of application for admission into B.A. (CBCS) Pass & Honours will be notified in the website.
- For online application students must visit the website of Silchar College i.e., www.silcharcollege.ac.in & login to admission portal and register their name and Mobile no. into the admission portal. Candidate must enter a valid mobile no. On this mobile no, an OTP will be send for verifying the mobile number.
- After successful registration the candidates will be able to apply their application for different courses offered by the College.
- After completing the required fill in the application form a candidate can review the application for any changes before final submission. No changes can be done after the final submission of the application form.
- 6. While uploading the documents :-
  - a) Passport size photograph of the candidate must be uploaded in JPG format of size (below 1 MB)
  - Scanned signature of the candidate must be uploaded in JPG format of size ((below 1MB))
  - For age proof, certificate, admit card, of HSLC or equivalent examination must be uploaded in JPG format of size (below 1 MB)
  - d) Candidates must upload their HSLC & HS passed mark sheet and certificate from a recognised Board or Council in JPB format of size (below 1 MB)
  - Cast certificate for OBC/MOBC, SC, ST(H), ST (P) must be uploaded in JPG format of size (below 1 MB)
- After final submission of the form the candidate have to take out a printout and keep it for future reference.
- Hard copy of the application form must be submitted to the office along with self attested xerox copies of all relevant documents and 3 passport size photographs within three working days of submitting online application.
- Students may have to submit original copy of gap certificate and migration certificate, if required at the time admission.
